Contest Purpose

To provide an opportunity for Educators Rising chapter members to document their growth and progress during their involvement in the Educators Rising program. An electronic career portfolio is a collection of work in an electronic format that tells the story of an individual including achievements, growth, vision, reflection, skills, experience, education, training and career goals.

How to Enter

A. Participants must be registered online for the competition by the submission deadline stated on www.edrisingaz.org

B. Submit the E-Portfolio link (and password if applicable) by the deadline via the link on www.edrisingaz.org

Judging and Scoring

- A. The judges' decisions are final.
- B. Scoring is based on the E-Portfolio rubric.
- C. Technology should be utilized to provide documentation in an organized and user-friendly manner.

Tips

- A. Start at the beginning of the year and maintain the portfolio for the entire school year.
- B. Include pictures of Educators Rising events and activities with dates.
- C. Portray knowledge of various technology tools throughout.
- D. Have a welcome page with a picture of yourself and a short biography.
- E. Customize the portfolio by choosing own colors and backgrounds but keep it uniformed throughout. Provide easy navigation with tabs and buttons that lead to various pages.

Oral Presentation

- A. Student presentation should include information on career summary, career-related education, educational enhancements, and special skills. Students should also discuss the samples of work provided in portfolio.
- B. Participants must bring all necessary supplies and equipment.
- C. Participants may use visual aids and samples related to the project during the presentation.
- D. Judges may ask questions at the conclusion of the presentation.

Competition Guidelines

- A. The entry should document the student's experiences in Educators Rising.
- B. Portfolio must be in a digital format.
- C. Audio and visual recordings may be included in the portfolio.
- D. Artifacts included in Electronic Portfolio must include captions.
- E. The portfolio must include:
 - Materials developed in class (artifacts/documents)
 - Rubrics
 - Lesson plans
 - Work with educational theories
 - Work with educational disciplines
 - Work with educational history
 - Career-Related Education
 - Resume
 - Career summary: description of career, skills and education required, future job outlook
 - Describe career related education that enhances employability. Include a summary of school activities, career research projects, and application of teaching skills as they relate to career choice.
 - Educational Enhancement
 - Describe educational opportunities that enhance employability. Include career planning opportunities, summaries of job shadowing, internships, informational interviews, community service projects, and outcomes developed through these experiences
 - Reflections
 - Work-based reflections on observations and teaching experiences.
 - Reflections on what the student wished he/she knew, his/her thoughts for his/her own future, and his/her thoughts on the future of education.
 - Special Skills
 - Include up to five examples of special skills, talents, and/or abilities related to job and career goals.

May be in any format but must fit within the dimensions of the portfolio requirements.
